

YOUR CHANCE TO BE PART OF GENERATION NEW ERA

Dear Parent,

We are writing to let you know that you have the chance to **be part of Generation New Era** – a new UK study of babies born in 2025-26, and their families.

The study collects important scientific information about children's health and how they grow up in our changing world. This will help improve support for families across the UK. It involves interviews with parents about themselves and their baby. As a thank you, every parent who takes part will receive an e-voucher.

Before the main study begins, we are testing our questions and processes with a small number of families to see how they could be improved. This is called a "pilot study". **Please note that by taking part in this you will not become part of the main study.**

Generation New Era is led by University College London (UCL). The interviews will be carried out by three independent research organisations – Ipsos, NatCen and Verian. It is paid for by the Economic and Social Research Council.

What happens next?

- **You don't need to decide anything now**
- In the next few months, Ipsos will send you more details and invite you to join the study.
- A trained interviewer will then call at your address, answer any questions you have, and ask if you would like to take part.
- It's your choice whether to take part and you can withdraw at any time.
- **If you would prefer not to receive any more information about the study, or if you do not want to be part of the study, please let us know and we won't contact you any further.**

What does it involve?

We will be asking mothers and fathers to take part in an interview. If you live with your child's other parent, they may have also received this letter. For one parent the interview will take around 60 minutes, and for the other parent around 30 minutes. **Being part of the study is completely up to you.**

We would like to speak to you again every few years to find out how your child is doing as they grow up – the next time will likely be when they are 3 years old. **It will always be up to you** to decide whether you want to take part.

How was I chosen for this study?

The families who have been invited to take part reflect the diversity of each region and the UK as a whole.

Your family was **chosen at random from records of births** held by NHS England for England and Wales, and Public Health Scotland and National Records of Scotland who provided your name, address and additional information about you and your baby.

We have special approval from NHS England's independent Advisory Group and the NHS Scotland Public Benefit and Privacy Panel to receive information from birth records so we can contact you. The use of confidential patient information without consent has received support from the Health Research Authority following advice from the Confidentiality Advisory Group. They reviewed the study carefully to make sure your data and privacy are protected.

What if I live apart from my baby's other parent?

To help us fully understand each child's life, we want to include mothers or fathers who live separately from their child's other parent. If you live separately from your child's other parent, we will ask you about getting in touch with them during your interview. If you prefer us not to contact your child's other parent, or if you have any concerns, you can let your interviewer know.

How is my information kept safe?

Your answers will be kept completely confidential and used only for research. UCL is allowed to use your personal data because the study is carried out for a task in the public interest under GDPR, the law that protects your personal information. If you choose not to take part, we will delete your information from birth records, after we have used this to help us understand who hasn't taken part.
